

The Confession of Lily Dare crystallizes his love of theater and classic films into a work of comedy, heartbreak, and honesty that is wholly Charles.

PLAYWRIGHT



CHARLES BUSCH has forged a unique place in the world of entertainment as playwright, actor, director, novelist, cabaret performer, and drag icon. He is the author and star of over twenty-five plays, including The Divine Sister, The Lady in Question, Red Scare on Sunset, The Tribute Artist, and Vampire Lesbians of Sodom, one of the longest running plays in the history of Off-Broadway. His play The Tale of the Allergist's Wife ran for 777 performances on Broadway, won the Outer Critics Circle John L. Gassner Award for playwriting, received a Tony nomination for Best Play, and is the longest running Broadway comedy of the past twenty-five years. He wrote and starred in the film versions of his plays Psycho Beach Party and Die Mommie Die!, the latter of which won him the Best Performance Award at the Sundance Film Festival. For two seasons, he appeared as Nat Ginzburg on the HBO series "OZ" and is the author of the autobiographical novel Whores of Lost Atlantis. He has directed two films: the Showtime short subject Personal Assistant and a

feature, A Very Serious Person, which won an honorable mention at the Tribeca Film Festival. Due to his love and knowledge of film and theater history, he has appeared as a guest programmer and in numerous documentaries for Turner Classic Movies, and has lectured and conducted master classes at many colleges and universities, including NYU, Harvard, UCLA, and Amherst College. In 2003, Mr. Busch received a special Drama Desk Award for career achievement as both performer and playwright, and was given a star on the Playwrights Walk outside the Lucille Lortel Theatre. He is also the subject of the acclaimed documentary film The Lady in Question is Charles Busch. He is a two-time MAC award winner and has performed his cabaret act in many cities, including San Francisco, Los Angeles, Chicago, New Orleans, Philadelphia, London, Paris, Barcelona, and New York. In winter of 2016, his show The Lady at the Mic premiered at Jazz at Lincoln Center's American Songbook series. His 40 years of Broadway credits extend from 1979's Tony Award-winning The Elephant Man by Bernard Pomerance, up to Robert Schenkkan's LBJ sequel The Great Society this fall at the Vivian Beaumont Theatre. In between, he has been a producing partner on Edward Albee's Three Tall Women starring Glenda Jackson, Lynn Nottage's Pulitzer Prize-winning Sweat, McNally's Master Class starring Tyne Daly (also in London), Katori Hall's The Mountaintop, Neil LaBute's Reasons To Be Pretty, Donald Margulies' Time Stands Still with Laura Linney, David Mamet's November starring Nathan Lane, Douglas Carter Beane's The Little Dog Laughed starring Julie White, Stephen Temperly's Souvenir starring Judy Kaye, and The Twilight of the Golds by Jon Tolins; along with the musicals Spring Awakening, A Gentleman's Guide to Love & Murder, The Visit starring Chita Rivera, and LoveMusik, directed by the late Hal Prince. He is on the board of the Glimmerglass Festival and is a broad supporter of the arts in general, spoken word and music and theater in particular.

PRIMARY STAGES

PRIMARY STAGES is an Off-Broadway not-forprofit theater company dedicated to inspiring, supporting, and sharing the art of playwriting. We operate on the strongly held belief that the future of American theater relies on nurturing playwrights and giving them the artistic support needed to create new work. Since our founding in 1984, we have produced more than 135 new plays. Our productions and artists have received critical acclaim, including numerous Tony, Obie, Lortel, Off-Broadway Alliance, AUDELCO, Outer Critics' Circle, Drama League, and Drama Desk awards and nominations. Primary Stages supports playwrights and develops new works through commissions, workshops, readings, and our education and engagement programs: the Dorothy Strelsin New American Writers Group, Marvin and Anne Einhorn School of Performing Arts (ESPA), Fordham/Primary Stages MFA in Playwriting, Teenwrights, Primary Plus Developmental Reading Series, our Free Student Matinee Program, TixTeen, and the Primary Stages Off-Broadway Oral History Project. Through these programs, Primary Stages advocates for our artists, helping them make important—and often transformative—connections within the theater community. ANDREW LEYNSE (Artistic Director) is currently in his 16th season as Artistic Director of Primary Stages. Andrew is a director and founding member of the Primary Stages Dorothy Strelsin New

American Writers Group (now in its 24th year), teaches for Primary Stages ESPA (Einhorn School of Performing Arts) and The Tepper Semester for Syracuse University, and is the Artistic Director of the Colorado New Play Festival in Steamboat Springs, Colorado. Andrew is a proud Board Member of A.R.T./New York and is a graduate of Carnegie Mellon's Directing Program.

SHANE D. HUDSON (Executive Director) is a graduate of the Yale School of Drama and Emerson College. Shane has served as Director of Development at Elevator Repair Service, Managing Director of the Yale Cabaret, Associate Director of Development at PlayMakers Repertory Company, General Manager/Marketing Director for Blue Man Group, Theater Manager of the Charles Playhouse, and Executive Director of StageSource. He is an adjunct professor at Marymount Manhattan College.

CASEY CHILDS (Founder) founded Primary Stages in 1984 and has directed many productions for the company. He served as the Artistic Program Director for the New Dramatists from 1981-1985 and was the recipient of the Carnegie Mellon Commitment to New Playwrights Award, as well as two Emmy Awards and many nominations for his extensive work in television. He is a past Vice President of the Directors' Guild of America and a past trustee of The National Association of Television Arts and Sciences. Casey has a BFA in acting and an MFA in directing from Carnegie Mellon University.


